B) A 21yr student is brought to emergency when his motorcycle skids in speed. He is unconscious, has Pulse rate of 60/minute, BP of 160/100mmHg. Has a wound over right temporal region with oozing of blood. His left pupil is dilated, not reacting to light and right pupil is normal size, reacting.

- ii) Write briefly about the treatment of this patient, in emergency 3
- iii) Write briefly about the investigations needed to confirm the diagnosis & definitive treatment of this patient. 5

C) A 55 yr. traffic policeman, presents in OPD with non healing ulcer over medial aspect of his left lower leg for 3 months. On examination, he has 3x2 cm superficial ulcer, with pigmentation around it and dilated veins above the ulcer up to mid-thigh.
