b) Glissonian approach to liver resection.
3. Compare the risks and benefits of trans-thoracic vs trans-hiatal esophageal resection in a middle third esophageal carcinoma. 5+5
4. a) Lymphatic drainage of the stomach. 6+4
b) Draw a diagram to illustrate the position of various lymph node stations in relation to D2 gastrectomy for carcinoma stomach.
5. a) Evaluation and management of an incidentally detected, asymptomatic gastrointestinal stromal tumour (GIST) in the fundus of the stomach. (3+4)+3
b) List the indications for adjuvant therapy in such tumors.
6. a) List causes of faecal incontinence. 3+7
b) Pathophysiology of faecal incontinence.
7. How would you assess and manage a duodenal stump 'blow out' after a BILLROTH II gastrectomy for a giant duodenal ulcer? 3+7
8. a) Indications and contraindications for neoadjuvant chemoradiotherapy in a patient with esophageal carcinoma. (4+3)+3
b) How will you assess such a patient after completion of therapy?

b) How will you evaluate a patient with a suspected motility disorder of the esophagus?
