4. What are the causes of thrombocytopenia in pregnancy? How will you evaluate such a case? What is the management of a case of ITP in pregnancy? 5+2+3
5. What are Millennium Development Goals (MDG)? What is their current status in India? Suggest ways to improve them. 2+3+5
