The bombings crippled the nation of Japan for many years. After the bombings, any humans that survived the initial blast were suffering from radiation exposure. Forty-five percent of the people who survived the exposure were alive, sixty years later and become part of the largest study conducted for the long-term effects of radiation poisoning. The study resulted in many upsetting findings. One of the most significant is that exposure to radiation increases the long-term risks of cancer, and that the risk lasts a lifetime. Unborn children exposed to radiation on average grow to be smaller and less intelligent than their peers.

Many of the women that were pregnant at the time of the bombing gave birth to children with congenital malformations that were attributed to the radiation.
